What the chemical industry expects and requires from rail

Focused on, but not just limited to intermodal rail operations





Good access

A comprehensive network of intermodal terminals, offering unconstrained access to a European rail freight network, with appropriate TEN-T infrastructure parameters

Responsive

Sufficient intermodal terminal handling capacities, minimizing truck turnaround times

Flexible

Sufficient frequency of train departures with a good reach to all relevant European regions and destinations

Reliability, reliability, reliability – train delays must result in immediate electronic notification of revised FTA

Reliable

An rail network resilient to disruptions, offering sufficient divisionary routes and capacities

Resilient

Door-to-door services at sustainably lowest total costs



Competitive

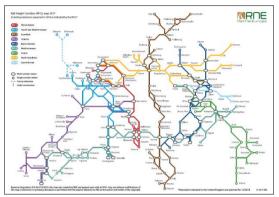
Peace of mind for our customers - reinstalling confidence on what is one of the most sustainable means of transport

We need more Europe in Europe

Enhance corridor thinking and empower Corridor Managers

Equal rights to freight trains alongside passenger trains

Transparency about performance based on agreed KPIs

- Speed up the implementation of the Sector Statement Priorities
- Ensure that the learnings from Rastatt will be fully implemented:
 - Good international contingency and crisis management
 - Sufficient spare capacity on suitable diversionary routes
 - Good international coordination of construction work
 - Harmonized operating procedures and systems
 - One common language
