2022 at a glance

In 2022, the authority tasks in Vehicle Authorisation, Single Safety Certification, and ERTMS Trackside Approval were timely delivered despite the significant increase in the number of applications received. Also, the recommendation for the TSI revision package, one of the main pillars of the EU railway system, was delivered in June 2022. The second three-year cycle of the monitoring of National Safety Authorities successfully started with a wider scope, and the Agency has continued the monitoring of Notified Bodies with significant deliverables. Furthermore, the Report on Railway Safety and Interoperability was published, providing a comprehensive overview of the latest developments referring to these critical aspects. The endorsement of the Strengthening Plan and the adoption of its related action plan led to the allocation of 12 additional posts for the Agency starting from 2023, in support of the priority areas of work, while continuing Agency's commitments for effective and efficient resource management. Moreover, the Agency continued the work on interoperable data and continued the development of the knowledge graph, where data from RINF and ERATV are integrated.
