



## Revised accreditation scheme and certification scheme

#### EA Resolution 2020 (46) 05

The General Assembly, acting upon the recommendation of the Executive Committee, endorses the mandatory application of the following documents, issued by the EU Agency for Railways (ERA):

- EAGA(20)11-20 Sectorial scheme for accreditation-ECM-1172-002 V3-1 and
- EAGA(20)11-21 ERA-1172-003 V1.1 -ECM Certification Scheme.

Between 16 June 2020 and 16 June 2021, under Article 6(3) of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/779, certification bodies may comply with either the previous or the new accreditation scheme.

As of 16 June 2021, certification bodies shall be accredited in accordance with the new sectoral accreditation scheme in order to be able to perform the activity of certification also for the scope of other categories of vehicles.

The accreditation scheme contains requirements to be used by National Accreditation Bodies or by recognition bodies when assessing certification bodies performing ECM certification. It shall be also used by Members States when designating the **NSAs to act as ECM certification body** (according to article 14 of Directive (EU) 2016/798).

> Introduction of safety critical component (article 4 shall apply from 16 June 2021)

Safety critical components are components for which a single failure has a credible potential to lead directly to a serious accident as defined in Article 3(12) of Directive (EU) 2016/798.

- > The ECMs shall use the safety alert IT to inform the rail sector about new or unexpected safety relevant findings concerning the maintenance activities (article 4 shall apply from 16 June 2021)
- > Annual report from ECM to Certification Body (Annex V)





Certification of Entities in Charge of Maintenance

Chargeable Services

An Entity in Charge of Maintenance (ECM) plays an important safety role in the European railway system by ensuring that the vehicles for which it is in charge are in a safe state of running by means of a system of maintenance.

This European system of certification for ECMs has been set up in Regulation 2019/779.

This regulation sets out:

- The criteria to be applied for the accreditation or recognition of ECM's and maintenance functions' certification bodies;
- The requirements and assessment criteria applicable for the certification of ECMs and the certification of maintenance functions.

The system of certification provides evidence of responsibility and traceability of the maintenance undertaken on vehicles. It sets out also a certification process that ensures a transparent and structured management system for maintenance functions described in article 14(3) of Directive (EU) 2016/798 and will help to reduce the burden and duplication of controls and/or audits across the rail sector.

Driving these certification processes, mandatory certification scheme for ECMs and maintenance functions is available for the sector and form the reference to conduct the certification activities.

ERA publishes the list of accredited and recognised certification bodies, as well as the ECM certificates in the ERADIS database .

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
